Short Break Grants for Families with Children who have Disabilities

The short break grant applications have been opened for this year! Families can apply for up to £400 to go towards a short break / support / respite activity.

The Sheffield Short Break Grant Programme provides a one off payment up to a maximum of £400 per family to support parents or carers of disabled children and young people to access a short break from their caring responsibilities. This could be things like gym membership, day trips, contribution to a holiday, cinema tickets, etc. that could be used at times that provide the greatest benefit to them as a family.

They accept applications from parents or carers who have a disabled child aged 0-19, where the parent or carer is a resident of Sheffield and where we have a responsibility for the child or young person, such as education.

If you are a parent or carer of a disabled child or young person, you are now able to apply for a Short Breaks Grant for the year 2015/16. Application forms are available from the school office or from the Sheffield City Council website:

information
for you and
your child



We believe that *all* our pupils should be given the best chance to do well in life. We know that coming to school on time, every day, is important if your child is to get the best start. There is a clear link between good attendance and good results, and we want to work together with you to achieve this by:

- Encouraging all pupils to arrive on time, ready to learn
- Talking to each other if there is a problem causing your child to miss school
- Recognising and rewarding good attendance
- Encouraging you to play a vital role in supporting our school and helping your child to succeed
- Working with school to achieve our attendance target

Our target for attendance this year is 95%

- Your child should be in the school yard (or hall if the weather is bad) by 9am, ready to be taken to their classroom for registration
- Registration begins at 9am and finishes at 9:10am. If your child arrives after 9am they are late and must report to the office.
- If your child is absent for any reason please contact us as early as possible on the first day

DID YOU KNOW?

90% IN A TEST IS GOOD BUT 90% ATTENDANCE IN YOUR CHILD'S LIFE = 1 YEAR MISSED AT SCHOOL!

10 MINUTES LATE EVERY DAY = 33 HOURS LOST LEARNING EACH YEAR

1 DAY ABSENCE EVERY WEEK = 2 MONTHS LOST LEARNING EACH YEAR

ARRIVING 5 MINUTES LATE EVERYDAY ADDS UP TO 3 FULL DAYS OF SCHOOL LOST.

ARRIVING 15 MINUTES LATE EVERYDAY ADDS UP TO TWO FULL WEEKS OF SCHOOL LOST.

ARRIVING 30 MINUTES LATE EVERYDAY ADDS UP TO 19 FULL DAYS OF SCHOOL LOST.

We want your child to do well at school and in later life -
let's work together

What our school expects from parents/carers

- The Law says that your child has to have a full time education between the ages of 5 and 16, and that you as the parent/carer are responsible for making sure they receive this. We expect this to start as soon as any child joins our school family and expect that parent/carers will help us by starting good attendance habits early
- To contact the office on the first day of absence if your child is not coming to school
- To tell us if there is any problem that is stopping your child from coming to school
- To make appointments for the dentist, doctor etc, out of school time whenever possible
- To only keep your child off school if absolutely necessary. A trip to the hairdresser, shopping or a day off for their birthday is neither acceptable or allowed!
- Any leave of absence from school must be requested in advance.

What you can expect from our school

- A good education, which is dependent upon regular attendance at school
- Regular information about how your child is progressing in school and prompt action to any problem you tell us about
- Contact from school if any absence is unexplained
- Encouragement for your child to attend regularly and on time,
- Regular praise and rewards for improvements in attendance
- Encouragement and celebration of good attendance.
- Notification to Parents/Carers over concerns regarding attendance through a tiered letter system.

Holidays in Term Time

Children between the ages of 5 and 16 are not legally entitled to holidays in term time. We would ask that you consider the impact of your child missing time from school, even at a young age. It can prove difficult to settle a child after any absence, particularly a holiday. S/he will have missed valuable learning and may find difficulty making friends again after a long absence. Parents/Carers can receive a fine for taking their child out of school for a holiday.

- If you intend to take your child on holiday in term time please ensure that you have informed school. You should read the Local Authority 'Exceptional Leave in Term Time' policy' available at school or at sheffield.gov.uk and complete a *term time leave request for leave in exceptional circumstances* form explaining why you are doing so
- The Head teacher can only authorise a holiday under exceptional circumstances, there is no automatic right to take leave
- Any parent taking a child out of school without authorisation is liable to receive a fixed Penalty Notice fine of £60 (per parent/carer) payable within 21 days. If unpaid the fine increases to £120 with a further 7 days to pay and, if still unpaid, a summons is issued for the unpaid fine.
