

Activities you could do at home:

- While out shopping count how many Fairtrade products you can see and the countries of origin.
- Try 'growing your own' in a part of the garden or in pots.
- Go on a minibeast hunt; record the different species and their habitats.
- Be an 'electric detective'; check your home regularly for electrical items. or lights left of unnecessarily.
- Give your child responsibilities for saving energy e.g. being the light monitor in the house.
- Clean your teeth without leaving the taps on.
- Let your child help you sort and recycle waste.
- Make a model out of empty packets and containers.
- Set up a bird feeding station outside, record the different birds that visit.
- While out walking, talk about road safety, encourage your child to take responsibility for checking the road with you.
- Use the internet or library to find out about endangered animals and the reasons they are endangered. Make a fact file.
- Go on a litter spotting walk and make a graph of the different types of litter found. Talk about the dangers/problems these different types of litter can have on the environment.
- Make a collage out of materials found outside (pebbles, twigs, fallen leaves etc.) Take a photo then return the materials.
