Children in Year One and Year Two follow the National Curriculum which is taught through cross curricular themes wherever possible.

We hope this booklet shows you how children learn about science and some of the content that they cover during their time at Waterthorpe.

Key Content of Science curriculum:


At our school we follow the National Curriculum in Year 1 and 2.

The National Curriculum states that in Key Stage 1, pupils should be taught about:

- Working scientifically
- Plants
- Animals including humans
- Everyday materials and their uses
- Seasonal changes
- Habitats
- Movement

The children will experience and develop a range of skills in science including:

- asking simple questions
- observing closely, using simple equipment
- performing simple tests
- identifying and classifying
- using their observations and ideas to suggest answers to questions
- gathering and recording data to help in answering questions



Each year we have a Science week dedicated to this area of the Curriculum.



Children have the opportunity to work with other schools in Science.



This includes teachers from Westfield and children from Emmanuel.

We learn outdoors at Forest School where possible.



We have a Forest School Club that is linked to Science.



How families can help support children's learning in Science:

- Visit a museum
- Talking to your child about changes in the environment
- Complete homework linked to Science
- Look at plants and animals in your local environment
