Work on reading and Phonics in Nursery

Reading and Phonics are key areas that we are working on as a whole school. Over the last few years we have been developing our work on these in Nursery and have introduced the teaching plan for phonics. As a result, we have seen the children make much greater progress with their early reading skills. It is important for children to attend regularly or they miss out on crucial teaching and find it harder to learn reading skills.



We also have a letter of the alphabet that we ask parents to focus on over a two week period. This letter is now shared on our weekly update so that you always know what it is. Next week it is the letter 'r'.

Big Pedal Breakfast Friday 27th April



MAST support appointments/Parent support Coffee Morning in Emmanuel Academy

The Multi-Agency Support Team are available to help families with a wide range of issues from problems with children's behaviour and bedtimes to housing and finance. The MAST worker will be able to advise you and put you in touch with the best agency to give support. All of us need some extra support or advice at times, being a parent doesn't come with a guide book!

MAST have asked that parents book an appointment for the sessions. The sessions are held on alternate Wednesdays. The next meeting is 2nd May 9a.m. to 10a.m. If you would like to see a worker then please ask your child's teacher or Key Worker, or let the school office know, and we will arrange this for you.

The Parent Coffee morning in Emmanuel is a group of parents who meet on alternate Wednesdays for a chat and give each other support with any day to day issues. The Learning Mentor in Emmanuel is also a former School Nurse and a parent herself; she helps to lead the coffee mornings. This is a great way to get advice from people who know what it is like e.g. when your child is having tantrums or wakes up in the night regularly. The next event is on 2^{nd} May.

Sport relief Day

Thank you for all your donations for Sport Relief. We made £130 in donations and sold two boxes of bands, raising an additional £60.

We were delighted when our Y2 children won the Family of Schools Sport Relief Mile event as the school that ran the furthest, for the age of the children, out of all the schools in our Family. The event took place at three venues across the area. We will now keep the Family of Schools trophy for the next two years.



Sheffield Children's University

Our School subscribes to the Sheffield Children's University and children earn 1 credit for every club they attend. Each term we submit our registers; certificates and medals are then awarded to children as they reach a given number of credits. Children may also wish to purchase a SCU passport from the library for a small fee and use this to gain credits at clubs they attend outside of school.

The awards are always a term behind as it takes time for registers to be collected and credits awarded by the SHU staff.



Two of these attended the ceremony, at Sheffield Hallam University, where they were presented with their awards. Bronze and Silver Awards are being presented in school in Merit assembly this week.



School Council News

We have now purchased a football table and baby clothes for the 'baby' dolls to use at playtimes in school. These have been bought using funds raised through selling ice pops and raisins at playtimes in school on Fridays. The School Council class members have held class councils with their classes to share the work they have been doing and also to remind everyone of the importance of recycling correctly and not leaving lights on unnecessarily. The School Council have been continuing their hard work to reduce traffic

Travel Plan Work

As you will be aware, we have spent a lot of time and effort consulting with pupils, parents, staff and the community about how we can improve the problems of traffic outside school. Being sited on a cul-

de-sac with very little parking, and another school next door, means that it is very difficult for families to use cars for bringing and collecting children. We are trying our best to make it safer outside school and we can see that the beginning and end of the day are difficult times for pedestrians and drivers alike. Thank you to everyone who signed up to the parking pledge scheme. Badges, designed by the children have been sent out to these parents to display in their cars or windows. Summer Johnson-Tyler was the winning designer for our school pledge.



Our zig zag design competition brought in some great entries. Hannah Knowles, Henry Sancho and Finley Stocks produced the winning designs, and these have been transferred onto a new banner for our fence.

Modeshift Stars Gold Award!

Because of the extensive work that we do on our Travel Plan we have been successful in achieving the Gold Modeshift Star Award. This is a tremendous achievement and we are very proud of all the great work that our children, families and staff have done to enable us to achieve this.



Traffic and Parking Improvement Plans ~ changes from 6th June:

Emmanuel School have now got a new gate with an electronic entry system. (On the other side of the school near the park.) Emmanuel staff will soon start using the carpark near this gate, therefore leaving more space in the top carpark for parents and visitors.



In order to further help reduce the traffic problems and safety outside school, from 6th June we will only be opening the middle gates (that join the schools together) between 8:45a.m. and 9a.m. in the mornings, and 2:45p.m. and 3:15p.m. in the afternoons. This is to allow access for parents who have children in both schools. The gate between the schools will be locked at all other times

During the school day the top Infant School gate will also be locked. Please note that entry to Waterthorpe during the day will only be through our small middle gate, adjacent to the main double gates. Access to Emmanuel will be gained through using the intercom on their main playground gate.

We hope that Junior School parents will park on the other side of Emmanuel therefore distributing traffic over a wider area. If, however, we find that this does not happen, and traffic is still a problem outside school following these changes, we will look at closing the gate between the schools at all times. (If this happened, it would mean families who have children in both schools would need to walk around the perimeter fence.)

We are sure that parents and families will be supportive of our plans to improve safety and make the journey to school less stressful. A recently reported incident of a car reversing into a child when exiting our carpark, makes it all the more imperative that we all work together to look at ways to improve parking and traffic issues.

Sports Update

In KS1, we have had Charlie, one of our link-dance teachers, teaching the children different skills. The children have really enjoyed it and were able to invite parents to a special dance workshop at the end of the half term.

Some Key Stage 1 children have been lucky enough to work with Mr Dungworth, our PE coach, in small groups. These were focussed groups that have worked on children's confidence, motor skills and listening and attention skills. The children loved it, and they were very excited to receive certificates at the end of the term.



Many children from Miss Wilson's class attended the after-school Athletics Festival in February, where they competed against other schools in activities such as running, jumping and skipping. They were delighted to find that when all the points were added up, they had come in 1^{st} place and had won the whole competition!

In March, Miss Brook's class were able to go to Westfield school to compete against other schools in the Mini-Gymnastics Festival. The children loved going on all the different apparatus and had a brilliant time.

This half term the Y1 children have been able to go on the Shine Bus. The bus had exercise bikes, a Wii-fit and other fitness machines for the children to try out. The day also included a talk about healthy eating, and they then made a healthy smoothie to drink. The Y2 children will be going on the shine bus in the summer term following a generator problem on their recent 'Shine Bus day'.
